







India-Mongolia: Forging Frontiers of Economic and Strategic Harmony


cybersecurity, and disaster resilience.

Uzbekistan's Grand Ascent in Global Investment: A New Chapter in Central Asian Diplomacy

The Tashkent International Investment Forum (TIIF) 2025, held from June 9 to 12, marked a defining moment for Uzbekistan's trajectory as a rising regional powerhouse. This fourth edition of the forum attracted over 8,000 participants, including nearly 3,000 international delegates from 97





countries, signaling the country's growing allure in the global investment landscape. The scale and scope of this forum were unprecedented—with \$30.5 billion in investment contracts and trade agreements finalized, representing a significant 14.6% increase from the previous year and nearly tripling the figure from just two years ago.

Tashkent has successfully positioned itself as the epicenter of new economic diplomacy in Central Asia. Under the reformist leadership of President Shavkat Mirziyoyev, the nation is advancing on multiple fronts—from energy transition and infrastructure development to digital transformation and regional connectivity. At the heart of





this international convergence was the active participation of the Global Trade & Technology Council (India), led by its Chairperson, Dr. Rashmi Saluja, accompanied by Chief Advisor, Mr. Rakesh Asthana and Director, Mr. Shubham Gupta. Their presence underscored India's growing interest in deepening bilateral and regional ties with Uzbekistan across sectors like healthcare, education, textiles, pharmaceuticals, and diagnostics.

The forum was not merely about signing agreements; it was a convergence of ideas, innovation, and intention. With 36 panel discussions, over 150 high-level speakers, and a large-scale industrial exhibition covering 12,000 square meters, TIIF 2025 offered a rare window into the ambitions of a country eager to lead in Central Asia. The GTTCI delegation, through strategic partnerships and sectoral dialogues, played a catalytic role in shaping outcomes that align with India's global vision for multisectoral economic cooperation.

GTTCI Visit to Kokand University, Andijan – A Vision for Educational Integration

As part of its broader educational diplomacy during the Tashkent International Investment Forum 2025, the GTTCI delegation undertook a significant visit to Kokand University in Andijan. This immersive engagement aimed to deepen the understanding of Uzbekistan's medical education framework and explore avenues for collaboration. The delegation, comprising Dr. Rashmi Saluja, Mr. Rakesh Asthana, and Mr. Shubham Gupta, toured three major academic facilities dedicated to medical and technical education, along with a state-of-the-art research laboratory, a pharmaceutical park, and several affiliated hospitals and polyclinics. These visits offered profound insights into Uzbekistan's evolving higher education and healthcare infrastructure, highlighting its readiness for global partnerships, a visionary project by its founder, Dr. Mukhtorkhon.





One of the most compelling highlights of the visit was the introduction to the proposed "Mini India City" project, shared by Mr. Iskandar of the university's international



relations department. This visionary initiative seeks to create a culturally familiar environment for Indian students in Uzbekistan, offering facilities such as authentic Indian



















cuisine, language and translation support, and dedicated spaces to celebrate Indian festivals and culture. Dr. Rashmi Saluja applauded the initiative, calling it a trailblazing model that could act as a hub-and-spoke framework for the entire CIS region, aligning perfectly with India's New Education Policy (NEP) and supporting the global expansion of Indian medical education standards.

TIIF 2025 Plenary Session: A Strategic Roadmap for Uzbekistan's Third Renaissance

TIIF 2025 unfolded as a convergence of global economic powerhouses, policymakers, and thought leaders in Tashkent, where the transformative economic vision of Uzbekistan took center stage. The plenary session, inaugurated by President Shavkat Mirziyoyev, served not only as a ceremonial opening but as a compelling narrative of Uzbekistan's reform journey, its current accomplishments, and its future ambitions. President Mirziyoyev delivered a





powerful keynote that covered a sweeping range of issues from global geopolitical challenges to climate change, from energy diversification to trade regionalization.

He spoke candidly about the need for collaborative efforts to combat growing threats to global security, food







stability, and the humanitarian crises unfolding in regions like Gaza and Ukraine. Expressing Uzbekistan's support for peaceful resolutions and diplomatic engagements, he noted that "Uzbekistan stands for peace, dignity, and mutual prosperity." The President's address also reflected Uzbekistan's historical legacy as a cradle of civilization and knowledge, linking it to a forthcoming "Third Renaissance" that integrates scientific innovation, green energy, and human-centric development.

The session was attended by high-ranking leaders such as Bulgarian President Rumen Radev, Slovakian Prime Minister Robert Fico, and Kazakh Prime Minister Olzhas Bektenov, alongside the Presidents of EBRD and New Development Bank. Each leader highlighted Uzbekistan's pivotal role in the Eurasian corridor, emphasizing the potential for transcontinental trade and digital connectivity. Bulgarian President Radev's speech particularly resonated when he called the Middle Corridor a "route of friendship, prosperity, and sustainable cooperation," pledging deeper bilateral ties with Uzbekistan.

Slovakia's Robert Fico described Uzbekistan as a "strategic junction in the Eurasian trade belt," lauding the country's infrastructure readiness and investment-friendly policies. The forum also spotlighted Uzbekistan's economic milestones: a doubling of GDP in the last eight years, \$35 billion in FDI last year, and an ambitious target











of \$200 billion GDP by 2030. The country's green energy initiatives were extensively detailed—highlighting \$6 billion in FDI into renewables, expansion in electricity production, and privatization plans for regional power grids.

Among the most noteworthy revelations was the development of the China-Kyrgyzstan-Uzbekistan railway project, a game-changer in Central Asian logistics and connectivity. The President also announced the launch of a Financial Stability Council and a National Reinsurance Company to enhance Uzbekistan's financial ecosystem. Digital economy, Al-enabled exports, and IT sector growth—targeting \$1 billion in tech exports—rounded off an incredibly progressive and inclusive vision for Uzbekistan's economic future.

GTTCI's participation in these high-level sessions underscored its commitment to aligning Indian business interests with Uzbekistan's development model, building new bridges for bilateral and regional collaboration.

As part of its outreach to high-potential but underexplored territories in Uzbekistan, GTTCI's delegation led by





In a momentous diplomatic occasion, Paraguayan President Santiago Peña Palacios embarked on his first state visit to India from June 4–6, 2025, marking a new chapter in bilateral relations between the two democratic nations. He was received with ceremonial honors at Rashtrapati Bhavan by President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, reflecting the significance India places on its engagement with Latin America. President Peña's visit is the first high-level visit from Paraguay to India in over a decade, indicating the growing strategic interest in expanding cooperation across continents.

This historic welcome also included a guard of honor, cultural exchanges, and bilateral meetings aimed at deepening political, economic, and people-to-people ties.

Strengthening Diplomatic Foundations

Diplomatic relations between India and Paraguay were officially established in 1961, and have steadily grown over the decades. India opened its embassy in Asunción in 2022,

a reciprocal gesture to Paraguay's longstanding embassy in New Delhi. Paraguay also maintains honorary consulates in major Indian cities like Mumbai and Chennai.

This visit builds upon that foundation by reaffirming mutual respect and commitment to South-South cooperation. President Peña described the India visit as a "strategic outreach to one of the world's largest democracies," aiming to transform traditional diplomacy into tangible collaborations that uplift both economies.

Trade, Investment, and Connectivity

During their discussions, President Peña and Prime Minister Modi explored opportunities to integrate Paraguay more closely with Indian markets, especially in sectors such as agriculture, renewable energy, information technology, and pharmaceuticals.

Paraguay highlighted its ambition to become a gateway for India to the 400-million strong MERCOSUR market—a regional trade bloc in South America that includes Brazil, Argentina, and Uruguay. In return, India emphasized its desire to increase its economic footprint in Latin America by investing in critical infrastructure, logistics, and value-added manufacturing within Paraguay.

Both leaders acknowledged the untapped potential of bilateral trade, which has hovered around \$300 million in recent years. The goal is to double this figure over the next three years through new trade facilitation measures, joint ventures, and preferential agreements.

Joint Statements & Cooperation Pillars

A joint statement issued after the bilateral talks laid out a multi-pronged cooperation roadmap focused on:

- Expanding commerce and investment frameworks
- Enhancing agricultural productivity and food processing
- Strengthening renewable energy projects including hydroelectric collaborations
- Promoting academic partnerships and technological research

The two nations agreed to explore bilateral preferential trade arrangements and collaborate on standards harmonization to reduce non-tariff barriers.

Goals for Collaborative Growth

India reiterated its interest in expanding defense engagement with Paraguay, including training, cybersecurity, and peacekeeping operations. Paraguay, in turn, welcomed Indian participation in energy infrastructure, fintech, agritech, and telecom—leveraging its stable macroeconomic climate and investor-friendly policies.

Both nations committed to supporting multilateralism and reforming global institutions such as the UN and WTO to better represent developing countries. This shared vision was echoed during their joint press interaction, where both leaders underscored the need for inclusive globalization.

People-to-People and Cultural Outreach

Beyond economics and strategy, the visit also focused on enhancing cultural diplomacy. Paraguay expressed interest in hosting Indian cultural festivals, yoga day celebrations, and promoting Sanskrit studies in its universities. In turn, India invited more Paraguayan students and scholars to its institutions under the ICCR and ITEC programs.

Discussions also touched upon easing visa regimes, enhancing consular cooperation, and facilitating direct flights and air connectivity in the future.

Why This Visit Matters

President Peña's visit comes at a crucial time when India is expanding its global diplomatic footprint, particularly in Latin America and the Caribbean. The engagement with Paraguay is a testament to India's Act Global policy, complementing its traditional Eastward focus with a new push toward the Global South. For Paraguay, this visit not only strengthens its strategic alignment with India but also elevates its visibility on the global stage. It aims to leverage India's expertise in technology, innovation, and inclusive development to modernize its own economy.

Terrorism, Trade, and **Tech: India-Central Asia Dialogue Charts Bold Path Forward**



India and Central Asia Forge Stronger Ties at 4th Dialogue in New Delhi

The 4th India-Central Asia Dialogue, held in New Delhi on June 6, 2025, marked a pivotal advancement in India's growing strategic engagement with the Central Asian region. Foreign Ministers from India and five Central Asian republics — Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan — convened for comprehensive discussions that emphasized mutual cooperation on regional security, economic connectivity, energy transition, and cultural exchanges.

This high-level forum, a key pillar of India's "Connect Central Asia" policy launched in 2012, reaffirmed New Delhi's

intent to broaden diplomatic, economic, and institutional ties with the strategically vital region.

Renewed Commitment to Regional Security

Security was at the forefront of the dialogue, with External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar opening the session by condemning the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam, India, which claimed 26 civilian lives. The foreign ministers collectively denounced terrorism in all its forms and stressed the need to combat radical ideologies and violent extremism.

The dialogue emphasized the urgency of collective responses to terrorism, with particular focus on improving intelligence-sharing, strengthening anti-terror



mechanisms, and enhancing coordination under the framework of the United Nations and Financial Action Task Force (FATF). Central Asian nations expressed solidarity with India's zero-tolerance stance on terrorism and agreed to deepen cooperation on counter-terrorism capacity building.

Deepening Economic and Trade Connectivity

Another key focus was enhancing trade, transit, and economic linkages. All sides highlighted the strategic relevance of the International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC), a multi-modal network connecting India to Central Asia via Iran and the Caspian Sea. The Chabahar Port in Iran was specifically recognized as a vital gateway for boosting Indo-Central Asia trade.

Efforts are underway to increase the use of national currencies in trade and expand digital financial platforms to ease business transactions. Sectors such as agribusiness, pharmaceuticals, textiles, processed foods, information technology, and tourism were identified as areas of high potential for two-way investments.

The ministers also deliberated on the creation of trade exhibitions, B2B forums, and digital marketplaces to enhance commercial engagement, especially among Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs).

Advancing Cooperation in Energy and Technology

Energy collaboration emerged as another top agenda item. India expressed strong interest in importing green energy from Central Asia, known for its vast hydropower resources and emerging renewable energy capacities. Agreements were proposed for technical training and joint ventures in solar, wind, and bio-energy sectors.

In a landmark move, India and the Central Asian countries agreed to establish a joint task force on critical minerals and rare earth elements. This cooperation is expected to facilitate shared exploration, knowledge transfer, and strategic stockpiling of key minerals necessary for emerging technologies, including electric vehicles, semiconductors, and renewable energy systems.

Cybersecurity and digital public infrastructure were also discussed, with proposals for collaborative frameworks to ensure secure data ecosystems, fintech innovation, and resilient digital supply chains.

Strengthening Cultural and Academic Ties

Building upon centuries-old civilizational ties, both sides reiterated the importance of cultural diplomacy. With a shared history rooted in Silk Route exchanges, India





and Central Asia committed to deepening connections through cultural festivals, heritage conservation, literature translation projects, and media exchanges.

India reiterated its offer of scholarships under the ITEC and ICCR programs, proposing to increase student exchanges, academic partnerships, and faculty development programs across universities in both regions. The Central Asian countries welcomed India's initiative to open new cultural centers and support consular ease for academic mobility.

Toward a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership

The 4th Dialogue took place amid a complex geopolitical landscape shaped by shifting alliances, energy realignments, and regional power dynamics. All six countries agreed on the need for a multilateral rules-based order that prioritizes peace, regional integrity, and sustainable development.

India's bid for permanent membership of the UN Security Council received continued backing from the Central Asian republics. There was also a call to develop institutional mechanisms for defense dialogue, cyber cooperation, and regional crisis response.

Modi's Mediterranean **Mission: Cyprus** Emerges as India's Strategic **EU Partner**

PM Modi in Cyprus: A Historic Step in **Strengthening Mediterranean Ties**

In a powerful demonstration of growing diplomatic engagement, Prime Minister Narendra Modi embarked on a landmark visit to Cyprus—his first to the island nation and the first by any Indian Prime Minister in over two decades. The visit, which marks a significant shift in India's Mediterranean outreach, blends strategic vision, economic optimism, and cultural diplomacy.

A Warm Welcome Reflecting Historic Ties

Landing in Larnaca on June 15, Modi was received with full state honours, including a ceremonial guard of honour at the Presidential Palace in Nicosia. Cypriot President Nikos Christodoulides welcomed him personally, calling the visit a "moment of pride" that reaffirmed the deep historical bonds between the two democracies.

Though diplomatic relations between India and Cyprus date back to 1962, the Prime Minister's presence underlined a renewed commitment to take this relationship beyond symbolism—towards concrete cooperation technology, and global affairs.

Cyprus Honours Modi with Its Highest Civilian Award

The most headline-grabbing moment of the visit came when PM Modi was conferred the Grand Cross of the Order of Makarios III, Cyprus's highest civilian honour. Modi, in a moving address, dedicated the recognition to the 1.4 billion people of India, describing it as a "symbol of the mutual respect and friendship" both nations cherish.

The award, named after Cyprus's founding President and archbishop, reflects the importance Nicosia places on India as a democratic partner in a region often dominated by competing powers.

A New Chapter in Economic Cooperation

During a vibrant business roundtable in Limassol, PM Modi urged Cypriot businesses to seize opportunities in India's rapidly transforming economic landscape. He emphasized India's leap towards becoming the third-largest global economy, driven by major reforms in tax regulation, digital infrastructure, and startup innovation.

"Start-ups are not just delivering dreams—they're delivering results," Modi said, highlighting India's booming entrepreneurial spirit. Discussions ranged across maritime logistics, clean energy, fintech, and artificial intelligence sectors where both countries could collaborate with mutual benefit.

An emerging trilateral mechanism involving Greece, Cyprus, and India also surfaced, suggesting broader regional ambitions.



Strategic Convergence and Global Connectivity

Cyprus's strategic position in the eastern Mediterranean opens doors for broader connectivity. Both nations signaled interest in developing the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC), a visionary project to improve sea-rail infrastructure across continents.

Modi expressed hope that Cyprus, an EU member poised to take on the EU Council presidency in 2026, could serve as a crucial node in this initiative. Discussions also touched on maritime security and shared concerns over global terrorism—areas where India and Cyprus find increasing alignment.

Symbolic Gestures and Cultural Connection

Beyond bilateral talks and business engagements, Modi took time to lay a wreath at the memorial of Archbishop Makarios III, paying tribute to Cyprus's national legacy. He also addressed the local Indian community, celebrating their contributions and reassuring continued support from the Indian government.

The diaspora response was emotional and festive, showcasing the enduring cultural ties that bolster diplomatic ones.

The Broader Context: A European Pivot

Modi's Cyprus visit is more than a bilateral stop—it is part of a carefully choreographed tour that also includes Canada and Croatia. The timing is significant. As India positions itself as a global power with strategic autonomy, partnerships with smaller yet geopolitically important countries like Cyprus offer new pathways for influence within the European Union and the Mediterranean.

Moreover, the visit sends a subtle but clear signal to regional actors like Turkey, reaffirming India's diplomatic independence and its willingness to engage partners on both political and economic fronts.


Looking Ahead




