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
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


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
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India–Uruguay Trade Relations: Strengthening Ties in a Global Context



GTTCI Trade Chamber Signs MoU with VTB Med to Advance Healthcare Cooperation between India and Russia



24th September 2025, Moscow, Russia

The Global Trade & Technology Council India (GTTCI) has signed a landmark Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with VTB Med LLC, Russia, marking a significant step in strengthening healthcare cooperation between India and the Russian Federation. The MoU was formally signed in Moscow by Dr. Rashmi Saluja, Chairperson of GTTCI, and Mr. S. J. Nechaev, General Director of VTB Med.

The collaboration aims to establish a framework for strategic partnership in healthcare, medical tourism, and allied services. Under this agreement, GTTCI and VTB Med will jointly work to:

- Promote Russian medical services among Indian and South Asian patients, especially in advanced fields such as reproductive medicine, oncology, organ transplants, cosmetic and reconstructive surgery, and telemedicine.

- Develop patient outreach programs, awareness campaigns, and networking opportunities across India.
- Facilitate cooperation between medical organizations of Russia and India.
- Explore collaborations in medical technologies, health insurance, and telehealth solutions.
- Conduct joint participation in roadshows, conferences, expos, seminars, CME programs, and publications, including GTTC Insights, GTTCI's monthly newsletter with a wide international reach.

The MoU is guided by the principles of equality, reciprocity, transparency, confidentiality, and compliance with international standards, and will remain valid for five years, with the possibility of extension.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Rashmi Saluja stated:

"This partnership with VTB Med

represents a proud step forward in delivering cutting-edge healthcare services and world-class medical expertise to international patients. By combining the strengths of the Russian healthcare





system with GTTCI's extensive global outreach, we aim to create new avenues for medical collaboration and patient care with excellence and compassion."

This MoU builds upon GTTCI's commitment to fostering global partnerships across diverse sectors and reflects its growing role in facilitating



cross-border trade, technology, and healthcare collaborations.

Vietnam and India Share Green Food Processing Models at World Food Expo India 2025



26th September 2025, Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi

Within the framework of the World Food Expo India 2025 (WFI) at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, Vietnam – as a Key Country – hosted a high-level discussion on “Sustainable Food Processing and Carbon Balance”, highlighting collaborative approaches to green production and environmentally responsible food processing.

The session focused on promoting sustainable production models, expanding biotechnology applications, encouraging cross-border investment, and shaping an eco-friendly food processing industry.

In his opening remarks, Mr. Bui Trung Thuong, Commercial Counselor of the Vietnamese Embassy in India, emphasized the urgency for countries and businesses to strengthen cooperation to reduce emissions and develop sustainable production practices. He also highlighted that this topic aligns with WFI 2025's vision, where the business community and international organizations share experiences, seek connections, and create initiatives to contribute to the global supply chain.

The discussion featured insightful presentations from both Vietnamese and Indian experts on innovative food processing models aligned with carbon

balance commitments, Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and responsible value chain development. Business representatives from both countries explored collaboration in technology transfer, sustainable packaging, renewable energy applications, and bilateral supply chain development, and proposed a regular policy dialogue mechanism involving governments, associations, and businesses.

Notably, Mr. Phan Thanh Loc, Founder and Chairman of Vietnam Food Joint Stock Company (VNF), presented his pioneering model “Turning Waste into Wealth”, which focuses on recycling shrimp by-products through a circular





economy approach. This model not only reduces greenhouse gas emissions but also creates a new value chain for the seafood industry and other sectors. Mr. Phan highlighted that Vietnam and India, as leading shrimp-exporting nations, face the challenge of processing hundreds of thousands of tons of shrimp heads and shells annually. His model provides a sustainable solution that optimizes value while reducing environmental impact, and offers potential for collaboration with Indian partners to accelerate technology adoption.

The discussion also featured distinguished Indian speakers, including Mr. Amarendra Khatua, IFS (Retd.), Secretary (Special Assignment), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, and Former Director General of ICCR, and Dr. Gaurav Gupta, Founder President, Global Trade & Technology Council (India). Their participation underscored the growing India-Vietnam collaboration on sustainable food processing and net-zero initiatives.

The session reinforced the potential for bilateral cooperation in the food processing sector, addressing shared challenges in sustainability, climate change, and responsible consumption. Initiatives from the discussion and WFI 2025 are expected to strengthen India-Vietnam relations, encourage investment, and inspire collaborative solutions for a resilient and sustainable food ecosystem in Asia and globally.






YDWA's mission is direct and powerful: ensure no promising wrestler loses their chance due to lack of infrastructure or support. The academy



India Shines Bright at the Asian Youth Games 2025 in Bahrain – A Historic Performance Led by CDM Padmashri Yogeshwar Dutt

The Asian Youth Games 2025, held from 22nd to 31st October in Manama, Bahrain, redefined India's standing in the world of youth sports. Under the stellar leadership of Padma Shri Yogeshwar Dutt as the Chef de Mission, India achieved its best-ever medal tally, securing 48 medals — 13 Gold, 18 Silver, and 17 Bronze — and finishing 6th overall among the 45 participating nations.

This outstanding success is a testament not only to the hard work of the athletes but also to the leadership, mentorship, and moral guidance provided by Yogeshwar Dutt. His understanding of sport at the highest level, combined with his humility and ability to connect with young athletes, played a crucial role in motivating the contingent.

The Games marked a triumphant



return after a 12-year gap, bringing renewed enthusiasm and competition from across Asia. India's contingent of 222 athletes, including a higher representation of women at 119, showcased

remarkable versatility and dominance across twenty disciplines — from athletics and boxing to kabaddi, judo, kurash, swimming, wrestling, and weightlifting.

India's medal journey began with a



beautiful moment of promise. **Khushi**, a 15-year-old kurash athlete, secured India's first medal — a bronze in the 70kg category. This breakthrough was followed by **Ranjana Yadav's silver** in the 5000m race walk, signaling India's rising performance in athletics. Soon after, the **Girls' Kabaddi Team** clinched India's first gold medal, defeating Iran in an electrifying final — a moment that ignited national celebration.

A historic milestone came when **Priteesmita Bhoi**, a young weightlifting prodigy, captured India's first individual gold by setting a **world youth record** in the girls' 44kg clean and jerk category. Her performance not only showcased India's strength in weightlifting but also became a landmark moment in the Games.

The final day of the Games turned out to be one of the greatest in India's youth sports history. The contingent



secured **15 medals in a single day**, including **seven gold**, across boxing, beach wrestling, freestyle wrestling, kabaddi, and weightlifting. Among the standout gold medallists were boxers **Khushi Chand, Ahaana Sharma, Chandrika Pujari, and Anshika**; beach wrestlers **Anjali, Sani Fulmali, and Arjun Ruhil**; and freestyle wrestlers **Moni, Yashita, and Jaiveer Singh**.

India's performance in kabaddi remained unstoppable, with both the boys' and girls' teams securing gold and cementing the nation's continued dominance in this traditional sport. The overall performance reflected a deep talent base that has been steadily nurtured by India's sporting infrastructure — including institutions like the Yogeshwar Dutt Wrestling Academy.











The Desk will:

- Showcase Suriname's energy and resource opportunities to Indian and South Asian stakeholders
- Facilitate B2B engagements, delegations, and investor roadshows
- Provide sectoral insights and project-level support
- Strengthen Suriname's visibility as a **strategic gateway to the Caribbean energy market**

GTTCI's Role as an Aggregator and Execution Partner

GTTCI brings to this partnership its proven capability as an **aggregator, facilitator, and execution partner**, working with over **100 foreign missions** globally. Through its platforms, including **GTTC Insights**, GTTCI will highlight Suriname's oil reserves, investment-ready projects, and policy environment to a global audience.

The Chamber will also support the Embassy in organising **India-Suriname business forums**, sector-specific roundtables, and high-level delegations focused on

energy, infrastructure, and technology collaboration.

Strengthening India-Suriname Strategic Partnership

The MoU reflects the **deepening friendship between India and Suriname** and a shared commitment to long-term, mutually beneficial economic growth. For India, engagement with Suriname supports energy security diversification and access to emerging oil markets. 
Karakalpakstan holds significant

From West Asia to Africa: PM Modi's Three-Nation Tour Reinforces India's Global Leadership



Prime Minister Narendra Modi successfully concluded a landmark diplomatic tour of Jordan, Ethiopia, and Oman from 15 to 18 December 2025, marking one of India's most significant foreign engagements of the year. Spanning West Asia and Africa, the visit deepened bilateral ties through major trade and investment agreements, high-level strategic dialogue, and prestigious honours conferred upon the Indian leader.

The tour underscored India's expanding global role in strengthening partnerships across strategically vital regions, advancing economic cooperation, reinforcing security collaboration, and promoting cultural and people-to-people links. Its outcomes are expected to have lasting implications for India's foreign policy, economic growth, and engagement with both the Global South and the Gulf.

Purpose and Agenda of the Visit

The three-nation tour was guided by key objectives: deepening diplomatic ties, expanding trade and investment, enhancing cooperation in energy, technology, defence, and security, elevating strategic partnerships, celebrating historic milestones, and promoting cultural engagement. The itinerary reflected India's broader strategy of fostering Global South cooperation and reinforcing its nuanced diplomatic presence.

Jordan: Strengthening 75 Years of Historic Relations

Prime Minister Modi's visit to Jordan, at the invitation of King Abdullah II bin Al Hussein, coincided with 75 years of diplomatic relations. In Amman, he held

extensive discussions with Jordanian leadership on regional peace, counter-terrorism, agriculture, energy, and technology, while also engaging with the Indian diaspora.

A major outcome was the signing of five Memorandums of Understanding covering renewable energy, water resource management, a cultural exchange programme (2025–2029), digital cooperation, and heritage twinning between Petra and Ellora. These agreements aim to strengthen sustainable development and technological collaboration.





Ethiopia: A New Strategic Partnership in Africa

In Addis Ababa, Prime Minister Modi held wide-ranging talks with Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed Ali, focusing on trade, infrastructure, education, technology, and peace and security cooperation. The visit reaffirmed India's commitment to Africa as a key development partner and advocate of inclusive growth.

A defining achievement was the elevation of bilateral ties to a Strategic Partnership, expanding cooperation across defence, health, agriculture, education, digital connectivity, and multilateral engagement. Agreements included UN peacekeeper training initiatives, educational partnerships, establishment of a data centre under Ethiopia's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and cooperation on managing Ethiopia's international debt under the G20 Common Framework.

In recognition of his leadership, Prime Minister Modi was conferred Ethiopia's highest civilian honour, the "Great Honour Nishan of Ethiopia". A notable diplomatic gesture was Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed personally accompanying him to the airport, reflecting the warmth of bilateral relations.



Oman: Economic Breakthrough and Strategic Deepening

The final leg in Oman coincided with 70 years of diplomatic relations and featured a ceremonial welcome in Muscat. Prime Minister Modi highlighted the comprehensive strategic partnership with Oman and engaged with the Indian community.

A historic outcome was the signing



of the India-Oman Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA). Under the agreement, Oman will grant duty-free access to over 98 percent of Indian exports, while India will liberalise tariffs on a significant share of Omani imports. The CEPA also enhances cooperation in services, investment, and professional mobility.

Prime Minister Modi was conferred

the "Order of Oman", the Sultanate's highest civilian honour, by Sultan Haitham bin Tarik, recognising his contribution to strengthening bilateral ties.

Broader Impact and Conclusion

The three-nation tour reinforced India's growing footprint across West Asia and Africa, delivering trade expansion, elevated strategic partnerships, and stronger security and cultural cooperation. It stands as a milestone in India's foreign policy, laying a strong foundation for shared prosperity, deeper economic integration, and long-term strategic collaboration.





UK PM Keir Starmer's First Official Visit to India

Strengthening Trade, Technology, and Strategic Ties



A New Chapter in India-UK Relations

United Kingdom Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer made his first official visit to India on October 8-9, 2025, marking a significant milestone in revitalizing the India-UK Comprehensive Strategic Partnership. The visit highlighted the shared ambition of both nations to enhance cooperation across trade, technology, defence, education, and sustainable growth, while shaping a progressive partnership under the long-term Vision 2035 framework.

The two-day engagement came amid renewed optimism in bilateral relations, following efforts by both governments to conclude a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) and strengthen people-to-people ties. Starmer's visit underscored the UK's recognition of India as a key partner in promoting global economic stability, innovation-led growth, and shared prosperity.

Trade and Investment: Unlocking a New Economic Era

Trade formed the centerpiece of Starmer's mission. In discussions with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, both leaders emphasized the importance of deepening economic integration and finalizing a fair and ambitious trade pact. The agreement aims to enhance market access, reduce tariffs, and encourage investment in emerging sectors such as green technology, digital finance, and manufacturing.

During the visit, the UK welcomed Indian investments worth nearly \$1.75 billion, reflecting confidence in India's economy and strengthening bilateral trade ties. The discussions also focused on creating jobs and opportunities in both countries through industrial collaboration and enhanced market linkages. Business leaders described the visit as a turning point capable of elevating India-UK cooperation to unprecedented levels.

Business and Industry: Delegation Diplomacy in Action

Prime Minister Starmer led a high-powered UK business delegation from sectors including fintech, clean energy, life sciences, and defence technology. The delegation participated in roundtables in New Delhi and Mumbai, fostering partnerships, joint ventures, and memoranda of understanding (MoUs) between companies from both countries.

The talks centred on leveraging India's digital ecosystem and the UK's global innovation



leadership, aiming to create synergies that enhance competitiveness. The visit reinforced that economic diplomacy remains a cornerstone of the India-UK relationship, promoting sustainable and resilient growth.

Technology and Education: Innovation as a Bridge

The visit highlighted growing cooperation in education, science, and technology. British institutions, including University College London (UCL), announced new collaborations with Indian universities and research centres to advance joint research in artificial intelligence, materials science, and climate technology. These initiatives aim to nurture talent, expand innovation pipelines, and build academic bridges between the two nations.

Both leaders agreed that education and knowledge exchange are vital pillars of the partnership, ensuring that future generations contribute to solving global challenges and empowering youth through cross-border learning.

Defence and Security: Towards a Stronger Strategic Bond

In discussions on defence and security, Prime Ministers Modi and Starmer reaffirmed their commitment to counterterrorism, cybersecurity, and protection of critical infrastructure. Both nations supported a free, open, and rules-based Indo-Pacific and emphasized joint

defence production, secure technology supply chains, and maritime cooperation. Strategic alignment complements economic and technological collaboration, creating a multidimensional partnership grounded in trust.

Innovation and Sustainable Growth: A Shared Future

Interactive sessions focused on digital innovation, renewable energy, and start-up ecosystems. Both sides acknowledged the potential of digital transformation and green initiatives as engines of growth. Starmer praised India's start-up ecosystem and clean energy projects, highlighting opportunities for collaboration in sustainable infrastructure, electric mobility, and climate resilience.

The leaders stressed that innovation-driven growth must be inclusive, people-centric, and environmentally responsible, offering a model for global partnerships in the 21st century.

Vision 2035: A Long-Term Roadmap

Central to the visit was the Vision 2035 framework, a roadmap to strengthen India-UK ties over the next decade.



It envisions higher trade volumes, expanded defence cooperation, broader education and research partnerships, and seamless investment flows. Both sides expressed optimism that this long-term vision will build a future-ready, enduring partnership anchored in mutual respect and shared values.

Conclusion

Prime Minister Keir Starmer's 2025 visit symbolized the evolving strength of India-UK relations. Highlighting economic growth, innovation, and democratic ideals, the engagement offered a tangible roadmap for collaboration across sectors. From trade and technology to education and defence, the visit reinforced the spirit of partnership that positions India and the UK to shape global prosperity and innovation in the years ahead.

Russian President Vladimir Putin visited India on 4th-5th December 2025 for a state visit and the 23rd India-Russia Annual Summit with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, reaffirming the enduring strength of the **Special and Privileged Strategic Partnership** between the two nations. The visit underscored the depth of bilateral ties and highlighted shared commitment to advancing cooperation across strategic, economic, and technological domains.

The summit coincided with **25 years of the India-Russia Strategic Partnership**, offering both sides an



opportunity to review achievements and chart an ambitious roadmap for the future. Discussions reflected mutual trust, respect for sovereignty, and convergence on key regional and global priorities.

Strategic Dialogue and Summit Outcomes

The two-day summit in New Delhi resulted in the signing of multiple agreements and joint frameworks aimed at strengthening institutional cooperation in defence, trade, energy, nuclear power, science, and culture. Both leaders reaffirmed their commitment to a multi-dimensional partnership capable of

adapting to evolving global realities.

Economic Cooperation and Trade Expansion

A major outcome of the summit was the adoption of

the Programme for the Development of Strategic Areas of India-Russia Economic Cooperation through 2030, which sets an ambitious target of increasing bilateral trade to USD 100 billion by 2030. The framework aims to diversify trade beyond traditional sectors and unlock new growth avenues.

Priority areas identified include pharmaceuticals, engineering goods, agriculture, chemicals, manufacturing, and digital services. Both sides agreed to enhance business-to-business engagement and encourage greater participation of small and medium enterprises in bilateral trade.

Discussions also focused on expanding the use of national currencies in trade settlements and strengthening financial connectivity. Progress was reviewed on advancing negotiations for a Free Trade Agreement between India and the Eurasian Economic Union, aimed at improving market access and reducing trade barriers.





Regional connectivity featured prominently, with renewed emphasis on the International North–South Transport Corridor (INSTC), the Chennai–Vladivostok maritime corridor, and the Northern Sea Route, all expected to enhance logistics efficiency and trade flows.

Energy and Nuclear Partnership

Energy cooperation remains a cornerstone of India–Russia relations. The leaders reviewed collaboration in oil, gas, and civil nuclear energy, reaffirming commitments to long-term energy cooperation and diversification.

In the nuclear sector, both sides agreed to continue cooperation across the entire nuclear fuel cycle, including fuel supply and lifecycle support for the Kudankulam Nuclear Power Plant. Discussions also explored cooperation in advanced nuclear technologies, such as small modular reactors and floating nuclear power solutions, aligned with India's clean energy goals.

Defence and Security Cooperation

Defence cooperation continues to be a central pillar of the bilateral partnership. The summit reviewed progress in joint research, development, and co-production of defence equipment, in alignment with India's Make in India initiative.

Both sides committed to

strengthening defence industrial collaboration, enhancing technology transfer, and expanding training and military exchanges. These efforts aim to deepen cooperation beyond procurement toward long-term industrial and technological partnerships.

A significant outcome was the ratification of the Reciprocal Exchange of Logistics Support (RELOS) agreement, enabling enhanced logistical cooperation between the armed forces of both countries and supporting greater operational coordination.

Science, Space, and People-to-People Ties

The leaders highlighted growing cooperation in science, technology, and space exploration, including collaboration between ISRO and Roscosmos in satellite systems, navigation, and future space missions.



Cultural, educational, and academic exchanges were also prioritised, with commitments to expand student mobility, research collaboration, and cultural programmes, strengthening people-to-people ties and mutual understanding.

Regional and Global Cooperation

India and Russia reaffirmed their shared commitment to multilateralism and coordination on global platforms. Russia reiterated support for India's permanent membership of the UN Security Council and expressed backing for India's BRICS Chairship in 2026.

Both sides underscored the importance of international cooperation in combating terrorism and promoting global peace, stability, and development.

Conclusion

President Vladimir Putin's visit to India for the 23rd India–Russia Annual Summit reaffirmed the continuity, strategic depth, and forward-looking nature of bilateral relations. With ambitious economic targets, expanding defence and energy cooperation, and sustained diplomatic engagement, the summit highlighted a partnership rooted in mutual respect, shared interests, and a long-term vision for regional and global cooperation.



In mid October 2025, Mongolian President **Khurelsukh Ukhnaa** made a state visit to India, reaffirming the historic and strategic partnership between the two nations. The visit yielded a flurry of high impact agreements across culture, energy, minerals, digital cooperation, and more — marking a new momentum in bilateral relations.

Milestones & Agreements: 10 MoUs Signed

During meetings in New Delhi, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Khurelsukh oversaw the signing of **10 memoranda of understanding (MoUs)** aimed at strengthening cooperation in diverse domains.

Key areas covered included:

- **Heritage and culture:** restoration of Mongolia's Winter Palace of Bogd Khaan, and exchanges of young cultural ambassadors.
- **Digital cooperation:** joint work on digital transformation, exchange of e governance solutions.
- **Minerals & geology:** agreements on geological surveys, resource exploration and knowledge sharing.
- **Immigration and mobility:** a pact between immigration agencies to share expertise and streamline processes.

India-Mongolia Deepen Ties During State Visit

- **Humanitarian aid & disaster relief:** collaboration in emergency response and community resilience.
- **Cooperative development:** promotion of cooperative investment, joint ventures, and technical capacity building.
- **Regional & local ties:** an MoU between Mongolia's Arkhangai Aimag and India's Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (Leh) for cultural and educational linkage.


Additionally, both leaders released commemorative stamps to mark **70 years of India-Mongolia relations**.

Energy & Industrial Cooperation: Refinery & Minerals

One of the most significant announcements was the Indian backed oil refinery project in Mongolia's Dornogobi region. Built using a **\$1.7 billion Indian line of credit**, this refinery is slated to begin operations by 2028 and will process up to 1.5 million tonnes of crude annually — about 30,000 barrels per day.

India is also exploring cooperation in minerals and energy sectors, including the possibility of importing **coking coal** from Mongolia — a move that could diversify India's supply chains and benefit its steel industry.

Moreover, discussions touched upon **uranium cooperation** and expanding supply chain linkages in critical minerals.



Defence, Security & Strategic Partnership

Beyond economics, the two nations reaffirmed their commitment to enhance strategic, defence, and security collaboration. India agreed to **train Mongolia's border security forces**, strengthening regional security and capacity building.

The visit also underscores the rising strategic convergence: India views Mongolia as part of its broader approach to Central Asia and the "Act East" connectivity narrative, while Mongolia pursues its "Third Neighbor" policy to balance its geopolitical position between Russia and China.

Analysts suggest the visit could "redefine the strategic partnership," shifting it from symbolism to operational cooperation across multiple fronts.

Cultural & People to People Bonds

The historic Buddhist connection remains central to the India–Mongolia relationship. Indian involvement in restoring monasteries, and the shared legacy of Nalanda University, were spotlighted during talks.

India also announced **free e-visas** for Mongolian citizens and pledged to sponsor annual visits of young cultural ambassadors.

A proposed air link between **Amritsar/Delhi and Mongolia** was floated to bolster tourism, business, and people-to-people contact.

Challenges & Opportunities Ahead

While the visit marked

significant goodwill and ambition, structural challenges remain:

- **Geographic constraints:** Mongolia is landlocked, making logistics and transport routes complex and expensive.
- **Scale of trade:** Bilateral trade has historically been limited, lagging far behind Mongolia's trade with China.
- **Implementation timeline:** Projects like the refinery and mineral partnerships need precise roadmaps to avoid delays and realize tangible benefits.

Still, the convergence of diplomatic will, strategic design, and mutual interests offers a rare opportunity to elevate this bilateral bond.

Conclusion

President Khurelsukh's 2025 visit to India was more than ceremonial — it was a strategic leap forward in India–Mongolia relations. With ten MoUs spanning culture, energy, digital cooperation, and defence, the visit showcased a shared vision of deeper integration.

As both nations commemorate 70 years of diplomatic ties, the challenge now is to convert lofty commitments into measurable outcomes. If



successful, this evolving partnership could become a model of how geography, history, and strategic foresight can align to build resilient, future oriented alliances.

Thailand's Foreign Minister Visits India: Strengthening Strategic Partnership



In a significant diplomatic engagement, Thailand's Minister of Foreign Affairs, Mr. Sihasak Phuangketkeow, paid an official visit to India from November 30 to December 1, 2025, marking his first visit to India in this capacity. The visit came at a crucial time amid evolving regional and global dynamics and provided a valuable platform to further deepen the India-Thailand Strategic Partnership. High-level interactions during the visit enabled both sides to review bilateral progress and outline future priorities across political, economic, security, and cultural domains.

Warm Welcome and Historic Ties

Mr. Phuangketkeow arrived in New Delhi to a warm reception from Indian officials, reflecting the long-standing civilisational, cultural, and diplomatic ties between the two countries. India and Thailand share centuries-old connections rooted in Buddhism, maritime trade, and people-to-people exchanges, which continue to shape their modern relationship.

External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal welcomed the Thai Foreign Minister,

describing the visit as an "occasion to strengthen the strategic partnership and enduring civilisational ties." External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar reaffirmed India's appreciation of Thailand as a long-time friend and an important maritime neighbour in Southeast Asia. He highlighted the strong convergence between India's **Act East Policy** and Thailand's **Look West Policy**, noting that this alignment provides a solid foundation for expanding cooperation in connectivity, trade, and regional engagement.

High-Level Bilateral Talks

A central highlight of the visit was the delegation-level meeting between Mr. Phuangketkeow and Dr. Jaishankar at **Hyderabad House**. The discussions covered the full spectrum of bilateral relations, including political dialogue, defence and security cooperation, trade and investment, digital technologies, connectivity, education,

healthcare, tourism, and cultural exchanges.

Both leaders expressed satisfaction with the steady momentum in bilateral ties and reaffirmed their commitment to sustaining regular high-level interactions. They also discussed strengthening institutional mechanisms and improving coordination between concerned ministries and agencies to ensure effective implementation of joint initiatives.

Focus on Security and Emerging Challenges

Security cooperation featured prominently during the visit. The Thai Foreign Minister also met **National Security Advisor Ajit Doval**, with discussions focusing on maritime security, regional stability, and transnational threats. Given their shared maritime interests, both sides underscored the importance of cooperation in safeguarding sea lanes of communication, ensuring maritime safety, and promoting stability in the Indo-Pacific region.

A key concern highlighted during the talks was the growing challenge





of **cybercrime and online scams**, which increasingly affect citizens across borders. India and Thailand agreed on the need for enhanced information sharing, capacity building, and coordinated responses to counter cyber-enabled crimes. The discussions reflected a shared recognition that non-traditional security threats require collaborative and technology-driven solutions.

Regional and Multilateral Cooperation

India and Thailand reaffirmed their commitment to close coordination in **regional and multilateral forums**, including ASEAN-led mechanisms, BIMSTEC, and broader Indo-Pacific initiatives. Both sides exchanged views on regional developments, including the situation in Myanmar, emphasising the importance of peace, stability, and inclusive dialogue.

The visit also reflected growing diplomatic alignment, with discussions on cooperation in global groupings and multilateral platforms. This convergence underscores the expanding strategic

understanding between India and Thailand on regional and international issues.

Economic, Connectivity, and Cultural Engagement

Economic cooperation formed an important pillar of the visit. Both sides stressed the need to **expand bilateral trade and investment**, strengthen business-to-business engagement, and promote collaboration in startups, innovation, science, and technology. The digital economy, space cooperation, and sustainable development were identified as promising areas for future partnership.

Showcases Nuclear's Future



The World Atomic Week (WAW), held from 25 to 28 September at Moscow's iconic All-Russia Exhibition Centre (VDNKh), brought global attention to the next century of nuclear innovation. Organised to mark the 80th anniversary of Russia's nuclear industry, the forum drew more than 20,000 participants from 118 countries, firmly establishing itself as the year's most significant global platform on atomic energy. Over four days, WAW explored how nuclear power—already positioned as a cornerstone of global decarbonisation—will evolve through advanced reactors, digitalisation, safety technologies and multidisciplinary applications.

The business programme was structured across thematic tracks such as clean energy, industrial innovation, ecology, advanced medicine, mobility, and digital transformation—showcasing the breadth of civilian nuclear technology. Discussions demonstrated how next-generation nuclear

systems are expected not only to meet rising power demand but also to shape future healthcare, transportation, climate action, and global industrial infrastructure. Round-table sessions examined issues including AI's role in industrial solutions, smart robotisation, raw material supply for nuclear reactors, the development of nuclear cities, and controlled thermonuclear fusion. Other panels explored electromobility, quantum technologies, the Northern Sea Route's long-term future, and advanced back-end solutions that

ensure long-term sustainability of the fuel cycle.

A major highlight was the impressive youth programme, including the grand finale of the Global HackAtom international student championship. Participants from 10 countries proposed cutting-edge concepts ranging from modular space reactors to nuclear-powered medical devices for astronauts. The event highlighted how nuclear innovation is fast becoming a frontier for young talent globally.

The opening ceremony, attended by President Vladimir Putin, IAEA Director General Rafael Mariano Grossi, Rosatom Director General Alexey Likhachev and other global leaders, underscored nuclear energy's growing strategic relevance. President Putin emphasised that nuclear demand could increase 2.5 times by the century's end, led largely by the Global South. He reiterated Russia's commitment to technological openness, non-colonial knowledge sharing, and long-term reliability in nuclear



partnerships. Several international agreements were signed during WAW, strengthening global collaboration in fuel cycle technologies, research reactors, nuclear training, and power plant development—reflecting the forum's role as a catalyst for concrete global cooperation.

Amid this global convergence, **Dr Rashmi Saluja**, Chairperson of GTTCI (Global Trade & Technology Council of India), participated in the forum and engaged with key international stakeholders. She noted that WAW's scale and vision reaffirm the critical role nuclear energy will play in balancing sustainability, energy security and economic growth. According to Dr Saluja, the forum's extensive focus on digital transformation, next-generation reactors, and youth capacity-building resonates strongly with India's long-term nuclear ambitions.

Dr Saluja also highlighted the unique potential of **India–Russia nuclear cooperation**, describing it as a partnership built on decades of trust and complementary strengths. India's expanding civil nuclear programme—supported by Russia through landmark projects such as Kudankulam—stands to benefit from Russia's advancements in small modular reactors, closed fuel cycle technologies, and specialised training. In parallel, India's engineering capability, regulatory maturity and rapidly rising energy needs make it an ideal long-term collaborator.

She emphasised that deeper collaboration in areas such as fuel cycle innovation, safety systems, isotopes, and joint research facilities could accelerate both nations' clean-energy transitions. As India expands its footprint in the Global South, the Indo-Russian partnership also offers opportunities for co-developing and co-exporting nuclear solutions to emerging markets, supporting global decarbonisation goals.

World Atomic Week 2025 thus not only



showcased the technological horizon of the nuclear sector but also strengthened global partnerships—illustrated by voices such as Dr Rashmi Saluja—affirming that the future of atomic energy will be defined by collaboration, innovation and shared progress.





India and Arab States Deepen Engagement at MEA-LAS Consultation Meeting

New Delhi, November 3, 2025 — The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) hosted a high-level consultation meeting between India and the League of Arab States (LAS) in New Delhi to explore new opportunities for collaboration across political, economic, and cultural domains. Chaired by Dr. Neena Malhotra, Secretary (South), the meeting brought together ambassadors of Arab nations, reaffirming India's commitment to strengthen its long-standing and multifaceted partnership with the Arab world.

Strengthening India–Arab Cooperation

The consultation formed part of India's ongoing diplomatic outreach to the Arab world, reflecting New Delhi's strategic interest in deepening engagement with a region that holds immense importance for its energy security, trade expansion, and diaspora welfare. The discussions centered on shared goals of peace, development, and mutual prosperity.

MEA Spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal noted that the meeting aimed to "further strengthen cooperation" between India

and the League of Arab States through sustained dialogue and actionable partnerships. Both sides underlined the importance of building upon historical goodwill and expanding collaboration across priority sectors.

KEY AREAS OF DISCUSSION

1. Trade and Economic Ties

Economic engagement remains the cornerstone of India–Arab relations. The consultation highlighted the need to diversify bilateral trade beyond hydrocarbons, focusing on new areas such as information technology, healthcare, renewable energy, and agriculture. The participants discussed ways to enhance business connectivity, streamline logistics, and facilitate investment opportunities.

Both sides recognized the potential of small and medium enterprises (SMEs) as engines of growth and encouraged institutional linkages between chambers of commerce to foster innovation and entrepreneurship.





2. Energy Cooperation and Green Transition

Energy continues to anchor India's partnership with Arab nations. While traditional hydrocarbon trade remains vital, the dialogue also emphasized emerging opportunities in renewable energy and clean technologies. Joint ventures in solar, wind, and hydrogen energy were identified as pathways for sustainable development.

The Arab countries' economic diversification strategies align with India's ambitious renewable energy goals, offering prospects for technology transfer, research collaboration, and capacity building.

3. Regional Peace and Security

The meeting reiterated India's support for stability and security in the Arab region, recognizing that peace is essential for global growth. Both sides emphasized the value of diplomacy, dialogue, and adherence to international law in resolving regional challenges. Cooperation in counterterrorism, maritime safety, and disaster response was discussed as part of shared security interests.

4. Cultural and People-to-People Links

Cultural exchange and human connectivity are integral to India-Arab relations. The

Indian diaspora, numbering over eight million across the Arab world, plays a significant role in strengthening social and economic ties. Delegates discussed measures to ensure the welfare of Indian workers, expand educational collaboration, and promote tourism and cultural festivals.

The meeting also underlined the importance of enhancing academic partnerships and youth exchange programmes to nurture cross-cultural understanding between future generations.

5. Multilateral Cooperation

India and the LAS reaffirmed their commitment to multilateralism and global cooperation. Both sides agreed to coordinate positions at international platforms on key global challenges such as climate change, food security, sustainable development, and digital transformation. The consultation also emphasized the need to promote equitable representation and inclusivity in global governance institutions.



Diplomatic and Strategic Significance

The MEA-LAS consultation reflects India's "Look West" policy, which seeks to build stronger strategic, economic, and cultural linkages with the Middle East and North Africa. The meeting reinforced that regular institutional dialogues are essential for aligning regional priorities and translating shared visions into tangible outcomes. For India, the Arab world remains indispensable — as a partner in energy security, a major trade hub, and home to millions of Indian expatriates. For the Arab League, India's growing global influence and technological strength make it a reliable partner in innovation, education, and sustainable development.

The Way Forward

Though the consultation did not announce specific agreements, it paved the way for new avenues of cooperation. Future engagements are expected to focus on expanding trade facilitation mechanisms, renewable energy collaboration, cultural partnerships, and educational exchanges. Both sides expressed confidence that continued dialogue will yield substantive outcomes beneficial to all member nations.
