

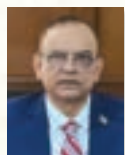

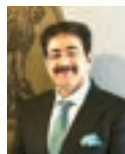

India–Uruguay Trade Relations: Deepening Economic Cooperation in March–April 2026

Strengthening Bilateral Trade and Investment

A key pillar of cooperation is Mongolia's rich mineral base

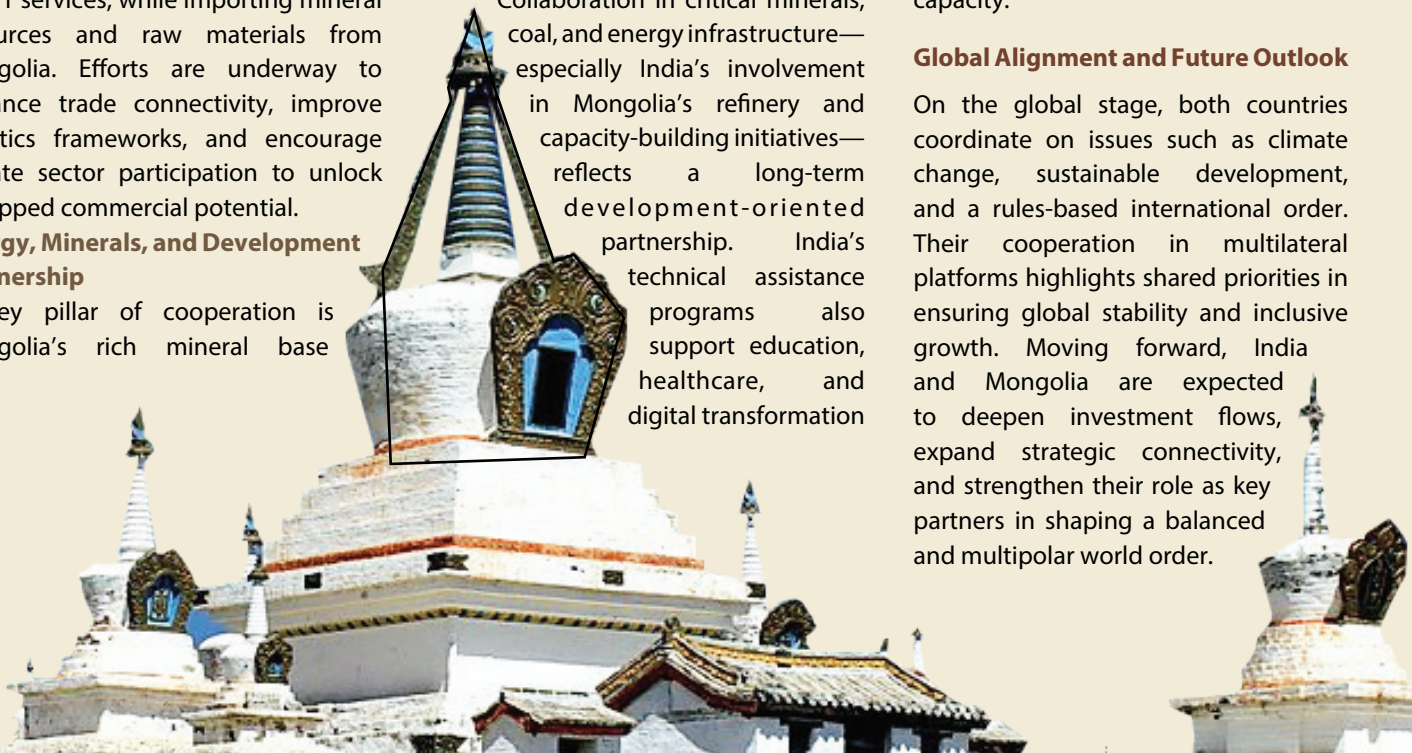

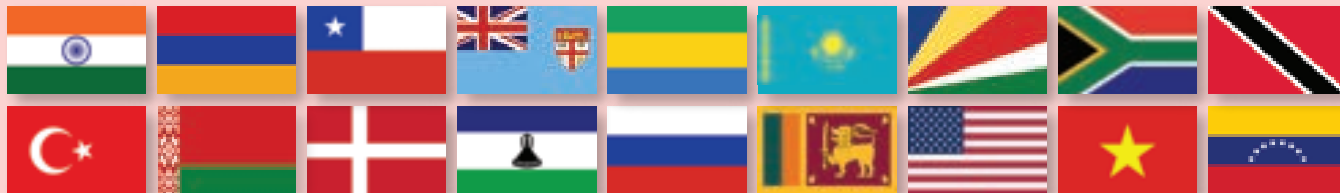
such gatherings among the diplomatic community serve as meaningful opportunities to strengthen people-to-people connections and deepen the spirit of friendship and cooperation among nations.

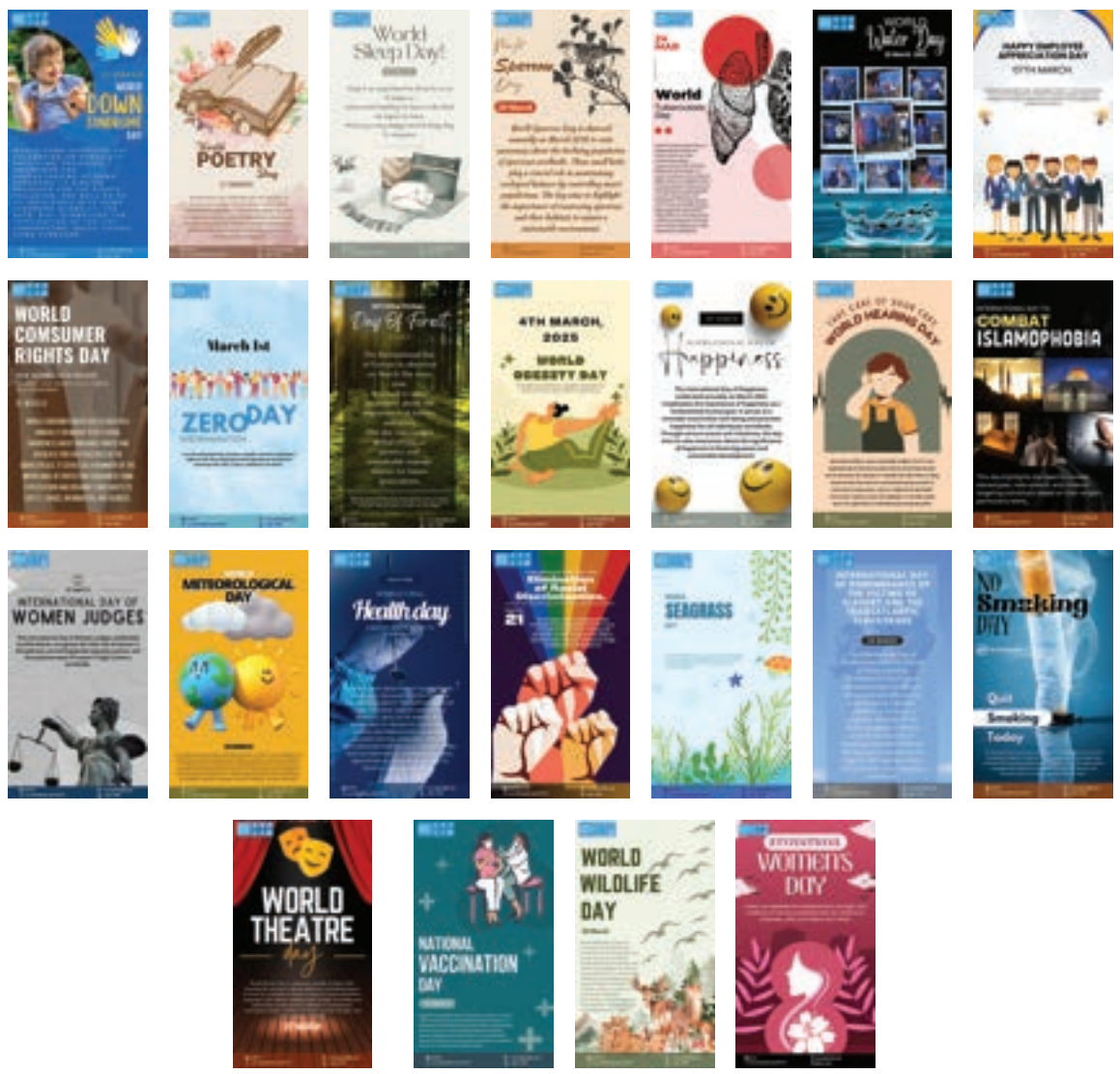

The 2026 edition was held under the theme "Samskāra–Assertion, Accommodation, Advancement." The theme reflected the importance of preserving national identities while embracing cooperation and collective progress. It emphasized the need for countries to balance strategic interests with shared responsibilities in an increasingly interconnected world.

The theme also highlighted how civilizational values and cultural





understanding can contribute to addressing contemporary geopolitical, technological, and economic challenges.

Global Participation and Strategic Dialogue

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Dialogue, while President Alexander Stubb of Finland attended as the Chief Guest and delivered the keynote address. Their presence underscored the growing significance of international cooperation amid evolving geopolitical realities. Raisina Dialogue 2026 brought together representatives from more than 110 countries and welcomed around 2,700 delegates. Participants included ministers, former heads of state and government, parliamentarians, technology leaders, industry experts, scholars, journalists, and youth representatives, making it one of the most diverse strategic gatherings in the world.

Addressing the Defining Challenges of Our Time

The Dialogue focused on six major thematic pillars covering geopolitical competition, reform of global institutions, sustainable development, climate change, emerging technologies, and international trade.

A key area of discussion was the emergence of a multipolar world order. Delegates explored the growing influence of emerging economies and the increasing role of the Global South in shaping global governance. Discussions

highlighted the need for inclusive institutions, balanced partnerships, and greater representation of developing nations in international decision-making processes.

Participants also examined the challenges posed by geopolitical tensions and regional conflicts while emphasizing the importance of diplomacy, dialogue, and cooperation in maintaining global stability.

Advancing Science and Technology Diplomacy

One of the notable outcomes of the Dialogue was the launch of the Raisina Science Diplomacy Initiative (SDI). The initiative seeks to strengthen the integration of science, technology, and innovation into foreign policy and international cooperation.

The framework focuses on key areas such as artificial intelligence governance, semiconductor ecosystems, digital



public infrastructure, and emerging technologies. It aims to encourage collaboration among governments, researchers, and industry leaders to address global challenges through innovation-driven solutions.

Technology remained a dominant theme throughout the event. Experts discussed opportunities and risks associated with artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, digital governance, and technological transformation. The conversations underscored the importance of developing ethical and inclusive frameworks to ensure that technological advancements contribute positively to global development.

Climate Action and Economic Resilience

Climate change featured prominently in the discussions, with participants stressing the urgency of coordinated global action. Deliberations focused on sustainable development, environmental resilience, and the need for innovative solutions to address climate-related challenges.

Trade and economic cooperation were equally important areas of focus. Delegates explored strategies for strengthening supply chains, enhancing economic resilience, attracting investments, and adapting to evolving geopolitical and trade dynamics. Discussions emphasized that economic security and international collaboration must go hand in hand to ensure sustainable growth.

Reinforcing India's Global Leadership

As the Dialogue concluded, it reaffirmed India's growing role as a facilitator of international dialogue and cooperation. By bringing together diverse voices from across regions and sectors, Raisina Dialogue 2026 demonstrated the value of constructive engagement in addressing global challenges.

The event highlighted India's commitment to promoting multilateralism, fostering innovation, and strengthening partnerships across the world. More importantly, it reinforced the country's position as a key contributor to shaping a more inclusive, resilient, and cooperative global order.





EAM S. Jaishankar's Brussels Visit Reinforces India-EU Strategic Partnership

Advancing a New Chapter in India-EU Relations

External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar visited Brussels, Belgium, on 15–16 March 2026 at the invitation of European Union High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy and Vice-President Kaja Kallas. The visit underscored the growing importance of the India-European Union strategic partnership and came soon after the recent India-EU Summit, reflecting the shared commitment to deepen engagement across trade, security, technology, connectivity, and global governance.

During the two-day visit, Dr. Jaishankar participated in consultations with the Foreign Ministers of the 27 EU





member states at the Foreign Affairs Council meeting. The discussions focused on strengthening political and economic cooperation while addressing major international developments and emerging geopolitical challenges.

Engagement with European Union Leadership

A major highlight of the visit was Dr. Jaishankar's engagement with senior European Union leaders and policymakers. The meetings provided an opportunity to review progress made since recent high-level India-EU interactions and to chart the course for future cooperation.

The discussions reflected the growing convergence between India and the EU on issues such as economic resilience, supply-chain security, digital transformation, clean energy transitions, and rules-based international order. Both sides emphasized the importance of maintaining regular high-level dialogue and expanding cooperation in areas of mutual strategic interest.

India and the EU discussed ways to enhance cooperation on maritime security, counter-terrorism, cyber security, and emerging strategic challenges. The conversations also reflected growing recognition of India's role as a key partner in addressing global issues and contributing to peace, stability, and sustainable development.

The visit further demonstrated the increasing alignment between India and European partners on the importance of resilient global supply chains, energy security, and effective multilateral cooperation in a rapidly changing international environment.



Strengthening Bilateral Ties with Belgium

Alongside his engagements with EU institutions, Dr. Jaishankar also held interactions aimed at strengthening India's bilateral relationship with Belgium. The two countries share longstanding ties in trade, investment, science and technology, and people-to-people exchanges.

Belgium continues to serve as an important gateway for India's engagement with Europe, and both sides expressed interest in expanding cooperation across sectors ranging from innovation and advanced manufacturing to sustainable development and logistics.

Looking Ahead

Dr. S. Jaishankar's Brussels visit reaffirmed the growing depth and maturity of India-EU relations. By engaging directly with European leaders and foreign ministers, the visit provided fresh momentum to a partnership that is becoming increasingly significant in global affairs.

As India and the European Union navigate a complex international landscape, the Brussels consultations highlighted their shared commitment to promoting economic prosperity, strategic cooperation, and global stability. The visit marked another important step toward building a stronger, more comprehensive, and future-ready India-EU partnership capable of addressing both regional and global challenges in the years ahead.



Defence Minister Rajnath Singh's Germany Visit Strengthens India-Germany Defence Partnership

Enhanced cooperation in these areas is expected to facilitate knowledge sharing, joint research initiatives, and technological advancement, benefiting both countries and strengthening their defence ecosystems.

The leaders also explored ways to deepen institutional cooperation and promote innovation-driven partnerships between research organizations, industries, and defence establishments.

Strengthening Military Engagement

Beyond industrial cooperation, the visit focused on strengthening military ties and capacity-building initiatives. Both countries reviewed ongoing defence engagements and discussed measures to expand professional exchanges, training programmes, and operational cooperation between their armed forces.

An important area of discussion was cooperation in United Nations Peacekeeping Operations training. This initiative reflects the shared commitment of India and Germany to international peace and security and

highlights their active role in supporting global peacekeeping efforts.

Such engagements not only strengthen bilateral defence relations but also contribute to broader international security objectives.

A Forward-Looking Partnership

Rajnath Singh's Germany visit came during the 25th anniversary year of the India-Germany Strategic Partnership and marked the first official visit by an Indian Defence Minister to Germany in seven years. The visit demonstrated the renewed momentum in bilateral relations and underscored the growing convergence of interests between the two countries.

More than a diplomatic engagement, the visit reflected a shared vision for a stronger and future-oriented partnership. 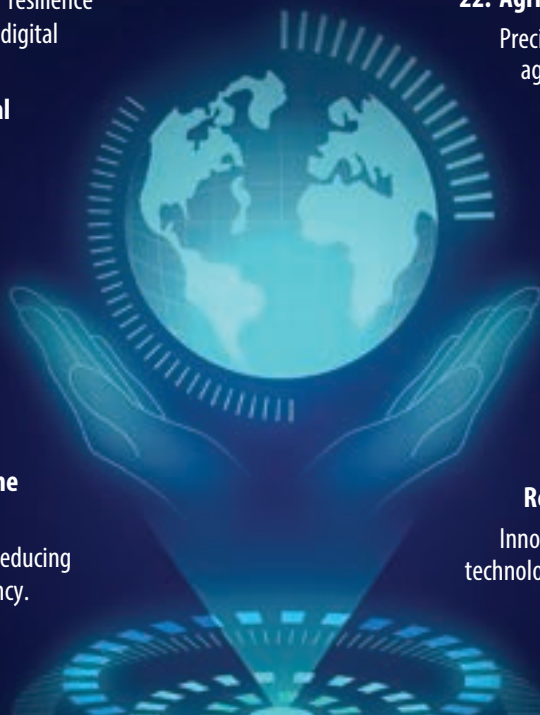

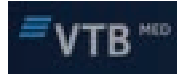
